### Have You Met Alice?

Alice is an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained and Employed.

Many individuals and families who have jobs - even 2 or 3 - are doing everything they can to make ends meet yet struggle to get by each month. ALICE represents the growing number of households that are above the Federal Poverty Line, do not qualify for many government assistance programs, and are working yet cannot afford basic necessities where they live to remain stable and self-sufficient.

ALICE and households in poverty are forced to make tough choices, such as deciding between quality childcare or paying the rent - choices that have long-term consequences not only for their families but for all.

This is why United Way of Central Washington focuses on ALICE to create solutions.
